Multi-Unit Dwellings are on the rise



Over the past 25 years, the number of occupied apartments in Australia has increased by 78%







3. Unlimited pickups and data

For \$50 per month, the building manager can:

- Book unlimited pickups
- Secure next day pickup for extra conveniency
- Access their data and share it with the residents





Repeat. Repeat. Repeat.

We asked building managers what is most challenging when it comes to teaching residents about recycling...

- 1. Keeping soft plastics out of the Council 'Yellow' bins
- 2. Keeping **soft foam** out of Soft Plastic recycling
- 3. Keeping hard foam out of **polystyrene**

⇒ It shows the importance of repeated, educational messaging: signage, newsletter, social media

Case study

A reduction of 5 red bins per week



\$74,000 saved in council waste collection fees

Source: from a building manager, self-reported estimates, based on the use of our unlimited pickups during 12 months for 262 units.

Why we believe it works

- Convenient: "#noexcuse" for building managers & residents
- Quick to implement: up and running in 3 clicks.
- **Solution oriented:** more than just an "Educational poster"; turning "wish cycling" into recycling.
- Disruptive: bright pink signage, uplifting and engaging comms: directly reaching residents at different times
- **Data focused:** helps build momentum and encourage progress

Rolling out now in 16 councils
