






Building a sustainable workforce that understand waste.





PVC Recycling in hospitals is well established across most Australian hospitals due to product stewardship with Baxter and Vinyl Council of Australia.













Medical Plastic Recycling – building a circular economy of clean plastic in Australia















Theatre /Clinical Metal Recycling



Recycle all single use metal into the dedicated theatre metal recycling bins.

These bins will accept all clean

- Diathermy wires
- Laryngoscope blades
- Single use scissors and forceps
- ECG dots
- eWaste

QCH averages 1.5 Tonnes of metal recycled every month!



Medical Metal Recycling


We mine the earth to create metal, we need to make sure it never ends up in landfill, it has an endless recycle capacity.

Food/Organic Waste Stream

Organic Waste creates methane in landfill sites which is 25 times worse than carbon emissions.

- Qld Dept of Environment Organic Strategy 2022 -2032
- Target for zero kitchen and ward organic waste to into landfill.
- Patient food waste is organically recycling into NuGrow Commercial Compost Industry
- Non perishable food is redirected fortnightly into Oz Harvest program for Children.












Children's Health Queensland Food/Organic Waste Stream

Kitchen, product, and ward plate waste is now all captured into our organic compost stream.


